ITEM DESCRIPTION

Jumbo *CRAYOLA* crayons Set of 8 true primary colours **ONLY**

(Red, blue, green, yellow, orange, black, brown, purple)

Lunch box Zipper or Velcro closing

Water bottle w/drinking spout 1 500 ml water bottle

Scissors No sharp ends

Pencils 8 – Regular #2 only

Construction paper 1 pkg. – large 9 in. x 12 in. pkg. – one inch thick

Kleenex 2 boxes

Erasers 2 – pink pearl or white, quality (Staples)

Glue 1 plastic container of white school glue approximately 120ml in size- (no glue sticks)

Photos of your child 4 - wallet size or snapshot

Shoes Non-slip, non-marking, Velcro or easy slip-on with backs (1 inch heels, no crocs because sand spreads throughout the classroom)

Backpack with zippers **ONLY**- Clips and snaps are difficult for little fingers, Large enough to carry lunch box, an agenda and shoes

Ziplock freezer bag 2 large – (27 cm x 28 cm) to take home Crafts etc.

Colouring book 1 large (1/2 inch in depth) or 2 smaller (no super heroes/ Bible characters welcome)

Blanket 33 x 58 inch/84 x 148cm

Pillow 3 x 17inch/33 x 48 cm

Complete change of clothes In case of an accident (top, pants, underwear, socks - in a Ziploc bag with child's name on it)

School box 8 in. x 5 in. x 3 in. deep, with easy snap closing

8 Yellow Tennis Balls 2 packs of 4 yellow tennis balls (Dollar Store)

· All supplies are due the first day of school.

· **Everything is to be labelled: name must be put on each individual item**

(i.e. every crayon and every pencil, boots, hats, coats, etc.)

· Dress Code: Please choose clothes without holes and that are neat, clean and tidy in appearance.
